The Director's Message

I would like to congratulate you, the students of the graduating class of the School of Ministry, Autumn Term, 2018, on your commencement. I am certain that the past 3 months have had many defining moments for you and as you graduate, I want to encourage you to keep pressing upwards and onwards toward the goal of the high call of God in Christ Jesus.



What an appropriate theme you have chosen for your graduation, "GOING INTO THE DEEP". I have been informed by your instructors that as a cohort, you have exemplified a great hunger for God and a desire to go deeper I salute you.

In Ezekiel 47, we see the vision that Ezekiel had of the River of God. The river flowed from the Temple and bega at ankle deep. Then the river deepens to knee deep, ther waist deep, and finally, the river was so deep that one had to swim in it. The challenge, of course, is to leave the comforts of where we are now and come into deeper waters.

I took up swimming at a very young age. My parents wanted me not just to learn to swim but to swim competitively. I remember my first swimming lesson. It was in the children's pool. And what is the one thing that defines the children's pool? It is shallow. But that's where you start. We all begin at the safety of ankle-deep water, but that is only the beginning of the journey. It is God's minimum because you really cannot swim in ankle-deep water, can you? You cannot even tread in ankle-deep water. All you can do is waddle.

But this is where we begin in our swimming lessons, ankle-deep water. The tragedy of this comparative to Christianity is that many Christians seem content to park themselves in this position. They prefer the shallow waters


Why settle for the minimum? Why get stuck at elementary truth all of your life? Why park here? It is sound advice never to follow a parked car because you will get nowhere. Keep moving on in God. Don't follow parked churches, parked pastors, parked traditions. Keep moving on and obey what the Lord told His disciples in Luke 5:4, "To launch out into the deep."

Don't stay at ankle-deep waters. If you want to learn how to swim, you have got to be willing to enter into deeper waters

I have been a pastor now for 29 years, and I have discovered that faithfulness is often demonstrated by staying put and digging deep. There are many Christians who are "spring" Christians who disappear in the winter. They are like the migratory birds that fly south during the cold spell in search for warmer climates. But an authentic Christian is characterised by faithfulness. They stay put even when the going gets tough.

I read in a book that logging companies do not just hire lumberjacks to cut down trees. They also hire specialised and trained people to repopulate the forest. These experts know exactly where to plant a tree to ensure quality production of growth. When they go out to reforest a mountain, they scan the slopes until they find what they call "stress" factors. Stress factors are the areas on mountains that are most exposed to winds and storms. Where the stress factors are located is where the saplings are planted.

It is there, on the rugged slopes of the mountains, that these trees produce the most sought after wood. From day one, these little trees will face the cruelty of winter and the harshness of summer. When the strong winds of winter come along, these trees know that if they want to survive, their only option is to sink their roots deeper



into the ground. To survive intense summers and extreme drought, and to survive they sink their roots even further down to find subterranean springs.

However, it is during these periods of stress that their trunks harden. Now, of course, not all the trees survive. But those that do will go on to produce the best, the most-desired, and the most sought-after wood. It is these trials- the suffering, the contradictions, the storms of life- that strengthen us to produce the best fruit if we can endure.

Perseverance is fundamental in the Christian life. Sometimes things can get tough in a church. I understand this. I have been a pastor for a long time, and I have seen a lot.

G. Campbell Morgan said, "If you have no opposition in the place you serve, you're serving in the wrong place."

The one thing I can tell you for sure: There is no such thing as a perfect church. It only exists in heaven. If there is a perfect church, do not join it because if you do, it will not be perfect any longer. There are going to be misunderstandings, but I plead with you, do not give in to the temptation to leave. Do not allow yourself to leave the very place where God planted you in the first place. You are the planting of the Lord.

The prayer of David in Psalm 144:12, that "our sons may be as plants grown up in their youth..." How are you ever going to be a tree that is solid and fruit-bearing unless you stay put in one place and go deep? We all start as saplings. But stay on in the place of God's choosing, and in that place, you will grow. No matter how difficult it gets, hang in there. Dig in. Even if sometimes you might feel overlooked by the leaders, stay. Even if you feel opposition, stay. If you stay, things will change. Where God has planted you, do not let circumstances circumvent you from the will of God. Do not allow little offences to become big issues. If you stay, you will grow deep.

In a recent trip, I took with my family to South Africa, we visited the famed Cullinan mines in Johannesburg. We had to descend 736 metres into the ground, via an elevator, but it is there, deep in the ground, where you find the precious stones. You hardly find any on the surface, but if you dig deep, you will get the gold. And that's my exhortation to you. Go deep. Do not settle for the shallow waters. If you go deep, you will find the hidden treasures of the kingdom.

Once again, congratulations on your commencement and we pray God's highest blessings on every one of you.

May it be that the 'Every Creature' mandate of Mr. Rees Howells be carried with you in your hearts and permeate the walking out of His unique call on each of your lives.





The Art of Mountain Climbing

"I love how small it makes me feel. And this is what I climb for," I said to my friend as we stood at the summit of Pen y Fan, surveying the vast Welsh moorland beneath us.

Before the term started, a small group of us decided to walk up the open, rugged ridges of Brecon Beacons. I love being immersed in nature, firstly because it reflects an aspect of God, and secondly because God tends to use His creation as a teacher to us. In this context, the grandness of the wild ridges and valleys humbled and reminded me of how God is far beyond all human imagination and comprehension. As I observed other groups of people trawling their way up a difficult route to get to the summit, I sensed Holy Spirit saying to me, "If you could only climb one mountain, pick the one you know is worth the climb."

Here are three brief lessons I have learned from the art of mountain climbing that we can draw parallels from for our spiritual walk:

LESSON

01

We need to have the right gear.

Too often we dream about climbing a high mountain but then do not because we find ourselves lacking the right shoes or gear for it. Others times, we go ahead anyway in our casual shoes and coats, only to feel the flush of embarrassment as we pass other trekkers along the way realising how inappropriately dressed we are. When it comes to packing, there are bound to be days when we forget to bring sufficient supplies for the climb. Or perhaps we are prone to overstuff our bags with all sorts of unnecessary 'in case of emergency' items. Whatever it is, we are unequipped for the journey or fall victim to under or over packing because we are uncertain of what the road ahead entails.

Yet in our life journey, Jesus exhorts us to travel light. During our time here in the BCW, He has led us to strip off unnecessary loads or cover-ups in many of our lives. We do not need to shoulder the weight of our past, pains, regrets, and fears around; they are neither useful for the present nor future. He is also equipping us with the right gear – the Truth of His Word, the power of prayer and intercession, discernment, humility, and unity amongst the brethren, etc. Through these seasons of preparation, He teaches us how to be adept in using them.

LESSON



Pick the right companions for the journey.

I remember a time I climbed a mountain in Spain with a fellow traveller I met overseas. He shared how he used to climb the Himalayas with his uncle as a kid, so he knew how to interpret the terrain based on the soil and taught me how to improvise and navigate through some of the trickier parts of the trail. Without him, I probably would not have had the courage or know-how to complete the trek.

Similarly, we need the right people to help keep us going on our journey through life. We need the right counsel from those who have gone before us and know the way ahead; people to warn us of treacherous roads but also to push us to overcome as they did. We need people who are encouraging and faithful to stay on the journey. Not only that, but we need to travel with people who have the same destination in mind – like-minded, like-hearted friends. Along the way, we have a duty to help encourage others along. Maybe you are with someone who is not as fit as you, but keep speaking life into them and holding them up. When you both finally reach the top, you will look at each other and rejoice – and the joy is doubled! The reward is definitely sweeter when shared.

LESSON

03

Pick a mountain that is worth the climb.

Back to what the Holy Spirit spoke to me at the top of Pen y Fan – that if we only have the time and resources to climb one mountain, consider carefully which mountain to climb. I knew instantly what He meant. You do not choose the mountain based on how nice the base looks, or because you know there is a nice halfway house along the way. You do not want to reach the top just to realise that the view is mediocre and disappointing. You also do not want to be thinking that you are climbing a certain mountain, only to reach the top and see the peak you are supposed to be on in the distance! That would simply be effort wasted.

But that is what happens when we get our priorities wrong. It happens when we get too busy in life, and God needs to come to redirect our ways because we have been striving up the wrong route, or travelling up a fruitless path or 'pointless' mountain. In these times He says, 'Come, let Me show you a better way.' On the contrary, if you have considered and chosen your path well and know with certainty the prize that awaits you at the top, you will find the strength to endure the climb. Purpose always gives pain a reason!

A Vision for Mount Zion

As Creator, God loves His mountains too, and He especially loves Mount Zion. Mount Zion, as referred to countless times throughout scripture, is both a real and spiritual place. The physical place is speculated to be on a hill outside of Jerusalem's walls. The land of Israel has also been referred to as Mount Zion. But more significant would be its spiritual and eternal meaning: Mount Zion symbolises the place of both God's presence (1 Chronicles 16) and His throne, or full authority (Isaiah 24:23). It is a place of worship where God and His glory dwells amongst His people (Psalm 9:11).

What does it mean then, for us to possess the vision for Mount Zion in our personal lives?

It means striving to reach the highest call God has for each of us – being faithful to the assignments He has for us and to keep the lamp of our first love burning.

It means having a vision for eternity – that having done all, they are not 'empty' works but we have found an abiding place before His throne.

It means to have the vision to *win* Christ – to know Him intimately and to gain Him (Philippians 3:8, 14).


Our faith journey is always an upward call. It is a costly one. but it is a mountain worth the climb! Therefore we need to keep travelling light, having the absolute essentials and the right gear, and with the right people who can encourage and challenge us along the journey.

In a mountain range, we have to overcome a series of peaks and valleys before finally reaching the summit. Likewise, in our faith journey, we cannot camp around one peak of blessings and stay satisfied with yesterday's revelations and victories when there are more peaks to ascend! The moment we do, we hit a plateau and may never progress in our knowledge and intimacy with the Lord, losing the vision of striving toward Mount Zion.

It says in Psalm 84:5-7,

- ⁵ Blessed is the man whose strength is in You, Whose heart is set on pilgrimage.
- ⁶ As they pass through the Valley of Baca, They make it a spring; The rain also covers it with pools.
- ⁷ They go from strength to strength; Each one appears before God in Zion.

The word "pilgrimage" in verse 5 properly translates into "highways," "ways cast up," or "ascensions in his heart". May our hearts always be set on a pilgrimage – an earnest resolution to keep journeying upward with and into God! We will face trials in the valley times, and temptation to settle on the lesser peaks, but He is faithful to strengthen and refresh us, enabling us to overcome the fatigue and busyness of life to keep pressing in for His upward call.


In March of 2018, I took a trip with my church to visit the BCW. On the last day, the man who helped plan our trip gave me a prophetic word. He said, "The undoing has begun." Immediately I knew what he was referring to and upon returning to the States, the Lord began a deeper healing of past wounds and open doors where the enemy had wrought devastation in me and my family. As God brought to light these issues that were unconsciously suppressed, I began to allow Him to bring closure and healing to my heart. Obedience to the Lord and taking up my cross became easier and as my heart continued to heal and be strengthened. As the time drew closer for me to attend the BCW, I had two separate dreams from the Lord detailing what would happen to me at the college. In both dreams, it was clear that a time of deep cleansing and healing is coming and that it would be a very transparent process to everyone around!

The first few weeks in the BCW was not easy. It felt like the furnace of purification increased in great measure. The vulnerable places of my heart – feelings of rejection, loneliness, and sadness - began to surface. In the past, I dealt with these feelings by denying and suppressing them in an effort to not be hurt. It was a natural self-protective mechanism which I was not aware was a wrong way to deal with hurts. Instead, I need to release my hurts to the Lord and walk in forgiveness. It was during the fourth week, the Lord gave me a revelation on how I have shut my heart from everyone else in an effort to protect myself. In doing so, I have also kept the Lord out from healing me. He showed me how I was going to be hurt, rejected, and despised if I were to set my heart to pursue Him while loving people in a fallen world - just as He did. From that moment everything began to change. My heart has opened up in a greater way to the people around me and the person within me began to emerge in an ever-increasing freedom from shame and fear of all kinds.

The vision of the Prophet Ezekiel found in chapter 47 is a beautiful picture of the Lord drawing us into deeper rivers of His presence and this was for me entering into greater breakthroughs as He draws me deeper into Him. I have become more sensitive to His voice and what was head knowledge is becoming alive in my heart. He has worked in us both to will and to do for His good pleasure (Philippians 2:2-13) that we might work out our salvation with fear and trembling (1 Peter 1:22). Through the fiery trials of

this life, He brings us to that point of surrender where He will be able to bring forth His image in us like gold purified through fire (1 Peter 1:6-7). In this time, I am learning that His revealed love for me compels me forward to find my courage in His strength and His joy in my trials. Indeed, He who calls us is truly faithful, who also will do it (1 Thessalonians 5:24)!







During the eighth week in one of our regular corporate prayer meetings in the Blue Room, the Holy Spirit brought such a Spirit of rejoicing, joy, and praise into the place. 23rd August 2018

Since my arrival at the BCW, every morning has been a refreshing time of walking and talking to God in the gardens, listening to the sound of every footstep breaking over the tiny pebbles that cover the garden paths, just like God walking and talking to Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden. Every morning, I cried before Abba Father asking Him if I have unconfessed sins in my heart, and if so, when will He deal with it?

MONDA

24th September 2018

On the fourth week of the course, our lecturer was teaching on the power of fasting. During his lesson, I began breaking out into cold sweat and experienced pain and tightening in my chest. I thought the enemy was hindering me from receiving my breakthrough that God was about to bring through the lesson. Immediately, I sent a text to my wife: "Pray for me. Under attack," assuming that it was a spiritual attack.

During the 10 a.m. break time, I asked the lecturer to pray for me, after which I felt slightly better. I continued attending the second lecture session and at about 10.30a.m., I started breaking into a cold sweat again and the tightness in my chest returned. I sent another text to my wife asking her to continue praying.

By the next break time at 11 a.m., my fellow students and staff advised me to go to the hospital regardless if it were a spiritual attack. Unbeknownst to me, God began to unfold miracle after miracle in Morriston Hospital.

PATRICK: Pray for me. Under attack.

Miracle 01

I was sent to the Accident & Emergency unit where I was still having intense chest pains. There was a long queue, and I was told that the waiting time could take up to two hours. The BCW staff who accompanied me prayed and God intervened. I was attended to within 30 minutes upon arrival! I was diagnosed with one right artery blocked at 95%, and the two left arteries were blocked, one at 90% and the other at 75%.

Miracle 02

I was worried about the cost and asked the doctors for the total expenditures for the procedure. His reply was, "At this moment your life is in danger. It is much more important to get the procedure done. Anyway, the state will take care of the cost." A sigh of relief for me! God is so good. Immediately, an angioplasty procedure was completed on the right artery.



TUESDAY

25th September 2018

The doctors further advised me to have the second procedure done. However, it would only be carried out upon payment of the total charge of £22k. While I was relieved that this would be fully covered by my insurance plan, it normally takes about two weeks before the claim is approved.

I had two options. The first was to be warded while waiting for the insurance to be approved, meaning I would miss two weeks of classes. The second was to be discharged and return to the hospital at a later date to undergo the procedure, but risk going unmonitored when my condition had yet to be stabilised.

WEDNESDAY

26th September 2018

In the morning, the hospital staff asked for the necessary documents to submit the claim to the insurance company. By afternoon, the insurance representative called the hospital ward to obtain an update on my condition and the recommended procedures for my care.

My wife and daughter arrived in Wales with the finances to pay should the insurance claims not be processed by the time of the procedure.

THURSDA

27th September 2018

The hospital staff informed me that the insurance approval letter had arrived within a day and that I did not have to pay in advance. The hospital will submit all documents and invoicing directly to the insurance company. I was scheduled to undergo surgery at 4 p.m. the following day but it was subjected to changes depending on any emergency procedure that will take precedence. In any case of an emergency, my operation will be postponed until Monday.

Miracle 04/

FRIDAY

28th September 2018

In the morning, my class and cell group prayed for my procedure to proceed unhindered. By 10.30 a.m., I received clearance for surgery and tears of gratitude flowed as I was whisked off to the operation theatre. The doctors came to check on me and approved my discharge for the following morning. I was discharged on the 29th, Saturday morning at 11.30 a.m.

God gave me the best and it was nothing short of miracles. If the procedure was done in Singapore, it would have cost much more. Later I learned that Morriston Hospital, together with Swansea University, specialize in heart research and treatment, providing me with some of the best care available in the region.

When I first received the word that God was going to deal with my heart, I did not expect it to be my physical heart. But during my time here, He has strengthened my heart, both spiritually and physically. I am grateful to the Lord for giving me a revived heart, and to my extended family in the BCW for praying and taking care of me!

A Deep, Internal Operation by Melissa Cheng Hsien Lim If you want me to go to the BCW, let me hear from someone other than Pastor Yang or Pastor Daphne as they are always encouraging people to go." I prayed this prayer to God two years ago during a church service when I had the desire to attend a Bible school course but I knew it was not the right time yet. Fast forward to two years later, I had originally applied to go to a local Bible school but just as I was about to submit the application, a church leader approached me and asked if I would consider going to the BCW. I felt the gentle prompting of God as the prayer I made two years ago came to mind and decided to apply for the BCW. While in the BCW, I was brought to remembrance of a dream He gave me some time back. In the dream, I saw myself standing inside a house overlooking a patch of luscious grass outside the window and instantly I knew I was in the BCW. Breakthrough in Hunger and Surrender



Before arriving at the BCW, I knew without a doubt that the Lord called me to this place and it would be a time of deep transformation and preparation. I came with eager expectation, looking for clarity of the call of God and direction for my life desiring to come out renewed and changed. The goal: to bring back to my local church what I learned and continue to grow and move forward into the call God has for my life and the church.

In the first week, the Lord gave a word through my father saying, "I want to speak to you personally." I did not understand at that moment what the Lord was trying to tell me, and so I kept that word in the back of my mind.

As the weeks flew by, during the first part of the term, I was extremely blessed to receive so much rich teaching, revelation, and being taught the nature of God at a greater and deeper level. However, I began to grow frustrated, wondering why the answers and the direction I came here to receive had not happened. The Holy Spirit persistently urged me to seek Him more, to hunger, and thirst after Him, but instead I was looking for prophetic words and public affirmation to feel valued and acceptable to God and others. I was focusing on the answers I was hoping for instead of seeking the One who gives the answers!

I continued to busy myself. I was striving in my own strength, finding my identity in my gifts and abilities, and many times doing good things but not the right things the Lord was directing me to do! The more I tried to strive in my own strength, the more exhausted and frustrated I became, but God came through for me! Little did I know that this frustration would become my greatest blessing.

In one of the classes, a lecturer mentioned that many times in our Christian walk, we come to the point of holy dissatisfaction, recognizing that there should be something more. This desire is an invitation from God to take His hand and allow Him to take you deeper into the next level. He mentioned the verse in Matthew 7:7 where it says, "Keep on asking, and you will receive what you ask for. Keep on seeking, and you will find. Keep on knocking, and the door will be opened to you." When we are desperate, we will not only ask, seek, or knock but sometimes we spiritually must kick down the doorway of heaven! We must be willing to do anything to get God's attention, to desire, and cultivate that posture of desperation and hunger for more of Him until we receive what God wants to give to us.

I have learned that in seeking God, I cannot do it out of a place of striving! It is essential to develop good discipline, but most importantly, to seek from a place of rest. In seeking God, I have also learned to daily carve out time where it is just me and God, to cultivate that discipline in order to feed that hunger and desperation for more of Him!

One of my breakthroughs came shortly after a teaching on discernment. The visiting intercessory prayer team went into a time of ministering. During a powerful move of the Holy Spirit, I received prayer and many prophetic words of whom God has called me to be, with much clarification for my future as well as new promises from God and commands I must obey during this season! With this great, encouraging and unfolding of His purposes, I knew the Lord had waited for me to arrive at this place of surrender and the desperation for Him, to seek Him to be the primary source for my acceptance, identity, answers, and the One who is the first priority in my life. 
Intimacy before Ministry



The Apostle Paul is one of my favourite characters described in the Bible. He was someone who dared to take risks, stepping out of his comfort zone, confronting challenges, and living daily by picking up his cross.




