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## From the Directors



We would like, first of all, to congratulate this graduating class of the School of Ministry, Autumn Term 2016. The past three months have been precious times of harkening to His voice like in Psalm 27:6, “When You said, “Seek My face,” my heart said to You, “Your face, Lord, I will seek.”

You have chosen an appropriate theme, ‘The Clarion Call’ for your graduation, especially in the light of the hour we are living in. “Blow the trumpet in Zion; sound the alarm on My holy hill. Let all who live in the land tremble, for the Day of the Lord is coming. It is close at hand...” (Joel 2:1). The imminent arrival of the Day of the Lord will be like the invasion of an army on earth. The warning has been given.

“ **BLOW THE TRUMPET IN ZION; SOUND THE ALARM ON MY HOLY HILL. LET ALL WHO LIVE IN THE LAND TREMBLE, FOR THE DAY OF THE LORD IS COMING. IT IS CLOSE AT HAND...**” (JOEL 2:1) ”

In my twenty-five years in full-time ministry, I have realised that many in the church are ignorant of what is going to occur in the last days. The average Christian is unable to articulate his beliefs, and when reading the epistles, you will discover that the disciples too had a running battle with ignorance in their day. The apostle Paul wrote to the early Christians, “I don’t want you to be ignorant” when he was dealing with events leading to the second coming of Jesus Christ. Our theology will affect our lifestyle one way or another, and we cannot be unaware about the second coming!

Mark Twain once said that it is easier to fool people than to convince them that they have been fooled. How true. Watchmen Nee said that the need today is for a company of overcoming saints who know how to wage war for the release of those under the enemy’s deception. The apostle Paul warned, “Let no one deceive you by any means; for that Day will not come unless the falling away comes first, and the man of sin is revealed, the son of perdition” (2 Thess. 2:3). So allow me to sound a clarion call for the church to awake and to arise.

On 27<sup>th</sup> June 2015, the United States Supreme Court voted narrowly 5-4 in favour of

gay marriages in America. This means that gay marriage is now enforceable and legal in all 50 states in America. Any attempt not to do so will be criminal. This is not just historic but one of the worst decisions ever made by any government in recent years. There is a complete meltdown of morality the likes of which we have never seen and it will not be long before heaven sends a corresponding response. The late Ruth Graham said that God would have to apologize to the inhabitants of Sodom and Gomorrah if He did not do anything about America. The sad fact is that many Christians see nothing wrong with and even support gay marriages, and this is symptomatic of the depth of deception that has permeated the body of Christ. The main cause of this is the lack of discernment in the church: many Christians no longer read their bibles.

We need to sound the alarm because the great apostasy is playing out right before our very eyes. By the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, Paul wrote: “Now the Spirit expressly says that in latter times some will depart from the faith, giving heed to deceiving spirits and doctrines of demons” (1 Tim. 4:1). There is a proliferation of false teachings; error always seems to run faster than truth. Matthew 24 is the great discourse on the

last days. When His disciples asked Him to describe what the times would be like, our Lord prefaced His sermon on the Mount of Olives and said, “Take heed that no one deceives you.” Widespread deception will characterize the last days and our Lord prophesied that false prophets will arise.

In John 8:45, we understand that when a person is born again, God puts something like a “Truth-O-Meter” in him so that when truth is declared, something in his spiritual DNA will resonate like an inward compass that points to true north. Our response to revealed truth is we must believe, and that is how we know we are of God. A refusal to believe revealed truth shows that there needs to be a re-calibration. In verse 47, the Lord mentions that if one is truly born of God, one will hear and obey. It is the love for truth that sets us apart from this world; this world hates truth because they are of the devil. He is a liar and does not stand in the truth, so do not be surprised when the world reviles and mocks at truth.

In Acts 8, we find a classic example of deception. There was a sorcerer in the city of Samaria and he astonished the people by his magic. In the narrative, all the people gave heed to him, from the greatest to the least, calling him the great power of God. When Philip the evangelist came into town, preached and performed great miracles, this sorcerer saw and knew he was out of Philip’s league. He, too, joined the bandwagon, believed and was baptized. When those in Jerusalem heard what had happened in Samaria, they sent Peter and John to assist. Peter easily discerned the condition of the sorcerer’s heart and rebuked the mad man for thinking that he could purchase the power of God. Peter then revealed that the sorcerer was poisoned by bitterness and



bound by iniquity. The point is that everyone thought he was great, including Philip the evangelist, everyone except Peter.

In 2 Corinthians 11, Paul tells us that Satan can transform himself into an angel of light and if he can do that, his ministers can also transform themselves into false apostles and workers. When a seducer comes to deceive God’s people with false teachings, he will come as an angel of light and speak what seems to be correct to disarm God’s people. If Christians are not careful and are swayed by charisma rather than holding on to truth in God’s word, they end up deceived by false and insidious doctrines. The ‘Clarion Call’ is - do not be deceived! It is going to be very difficult to discern between those who are of the Lord and those who are not of Him. The parable of the wheat and tares in Matthew 13 tell us that both look alike. It is not our job to separate the wheat from the tares because if we do, we can damage the wheat in the process. The Lord told us

that the angels would do that. So what is our task?

It is to stay diligent and not fall asleep. Remember, when men fell asleep, the enemy came to sow tares among the wheat. It is vital that the leadership of the church is always vigilant, watching and praying. If we seek the Lord continually, we will bear witness within our hearts when false doctrines arise that they are not of the Lord. If we walk in holiness and uprightness before the Lord, He will protect and uphold us. I believe in the infallibility and inerrancy of the Word of God. This means that it will endure for eternity; it is unchanging, and without error. Everything that God says is going to happen will happen. Not a single iota of His Word will go unfulfilled.

The apostle Peter says, “And we have the prophetic word confirmed, which you do well to heed as a light that shines in a dark place, until the day dawns and the Morning-

star rises in your hearts” (2 Pet. 1:19). The Morning Star is the planet Venus which appears when the darkness of the night passes away. It heralds the coming of the glorious luminary, the sun. During certain seasons, the Morningstar appears beautifully in the east and rises just before the sun, signaling a brand new day; it is a harbinger. As the day draws near, those who are in the will of God will sense the rising of the Morningstar. And when it rises in our hearts, watch for the dawning of a new day; it is about to break in on us!

*I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord’s holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge – that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever! “God, help me to never settle for the lesser,” has been my prayer through the years. My heart could never find a resting place except in Him. That much I discovered each time I moved away from the abiding place. I

came to the Bible College of Wales to abide once again, but this time with great expectations of finding my rest and my reward in Christ Jesus.

When I think of how Jesus silenced the winds and stilled the waves with His *Ruach* (breath), the hope of true rest crystallizes within. Here in Swansea, I learnt to breathe again, and with every breath, to rest instead of labour. The air is marvelously fresh.

For three months, I have been blessed to live in Mumbles, located near the coast. My breath has been taken away by glorious skies accompanied by the rhythm of choppy waters. I love watching each wave crescendo and the occasional seagull which calmly sits on the waters and flies over each coming wave at regular intervals. These are instances of “overcoming.” I have taken cliff walks overlooking the Bristol channel. I simply stare as far as I can and imagine what “seeing beyond” in the Spirit entails. I listen to the crashing waves and, through imagination, amplify that into the “sound from heaven like the roar of many waters” (Rev. 14:2).

What we perceive in the natural with our physical senses have a parallel in the spiritual world. Through the ‘seeing’ and ‘hearing’ in this precious time in Swansea, I believe that the Lord has deposited into my spirit wonderful and marvelous things that I do not yet comprehend – mysteries hidden but will be revealed when the earth is filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord as the waters cover the sea (Hab. 2:14). That time is coming, speedily. And I shall then be swimming, very happily.





# HEART'S DESIRES AWAKENED

## Psalm 37:4-5

**“Delight yourself in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the Lord; trust in Him, and He will act.”**

I was given a copy of *‘Rees Howells: Intercessor’* in 2000 by my spiritual grandmother. I was in my final year at university and uncertain about my future. After reading the book, I told the Lord that I would like to go to the Bible College of Wales (BCW) someday, though I did not even know where Wales was located! It all seemed a bit of an impossibility as I lived in the United States and the prospect of such a venture seemed improbable; so I tucked away my heart’s desire and carried on with other things that the Lord had given me to pursue.

In 2010, I got married to an Englishman, Dave, and the Lord spoke to us at the beginning of 2012 about moving to the U.K. permanently as a launchpad into other nations. After prayer and meeting with our church leaders in the U.S., our

church commissioned us in July 2012, to go back to the U.K. to help fan the fires of revival.

The Lord directed our steps to Guildford, Surrey and I gained employment at our local YMCA where I was a support worker for young, homeless people in the community. We became active in our local church, discipling youths and serving on the wider leadership team. Though walking in joyful obedience to what the Lord called us to do, I began to feel restless in my spirit, desiring more of God but I found my yearnings difficult to articulate. I read through *‘Rees Howells: Intercessor’* again and secretly longed to connect with the college somehow.

Several years later, in January this year, my husband and I were visiting friends in Llanelli, a place we had visited a couple

of times each year since relocating to the U.K. Before heading back home this time, we decided to go to the BCW which we learned had been purchased and refurbished by Cornerstone Community Church in Singapore. It was raining heavily but we persevered and drove to the college. We pulled into the parking area and began to pray for the students and the college to be a place where intercession would release revival.

In June 2016, the Lord began to speak to Dave and I about being a part of a community of intercessors. We also received several prophetic words about having a ministry that would build a bridge between the community and the church that would be used for cross-generational discipleship. I kept hearing and seeing ‘1 August’ each time I prayed and I

believed it was significant!

On 26 July 2016, I received a text from a friend who had spontaneously visited the BCW that day. She said that while praying in the Italian Garden, she had a ‘burning in her belly’ and saw my face and knew that the Lord had a connection for me there. I had never spoken with her about the desire of my heart to go to the BCW. I showed Dave the text message. We then went on the internet together and I showed him the curriculum. Finally, I was able to articulate the restlessness in my spirit as we read through the course description together. The Holy Spirit came upon us both and we began to rejoice! Dave said that he had not seen me so alive in a long time. After spending a day in fasting and prayer, we heard the Lord tell us to ‘go’ and He would lead us step by step

as we move in faith (Ps. 119:105). I downloaded the application and noticed that the deadline to apply was 1 August 2016!

We worked quickly and put in resignations to our jobs and lease of our flat. I received my acceptance letter from the BCW and we were able to raise funds in just two days for rent and the course fees. We packed our car with just a few belongings and made the move to the BCW. This has been a glorious journey, 16 years in the making, of seeing my heart’s desires fulfilled and trusting in the Lord to act.

# OUR BROKENNESS

The more the Lord breaks me, the more I surrender to Him. Ever since my supernatural encounter with Jesus in 2011, I have worked to proclaim His Kingdom because this gospel has the power to transform lives, and what keeps me going is my passion for Jesus. On the day of my amazing encounter with Jesus, there were many supernatural things that I could not understand. But what was real was seeing Jesus and feeling the embrace of the Holy Spirit.

My childhood and youth were taken away by physical and verbal abuse; I became very angry with everybody and this anger took control of me. My life was empty, bereft of love, and full of problems and addictions. I was living in darkness, but when I met Jesus, He changed my life forever. I was drunk with the Holy Spirit for seven days. From that day onwards, I have been dancing for Jesus and crying all the time in His presence. For I had become God's daughter, and was grateful that

He gave me an identity in Him. I learned to walk in His will with the authority and freedom of His Kingdom. He called me to be His ambassador, to proclaim the good news of His gospel. He changed my dirty clothes and covered me with His holiness. I was reborn and given a new life by His power.

My heart was simply filled with His love, and this went on for three years after I encountered Jesus: I wept easily. I was weeping because His presence captivated me and my heart was filled with thankfulness. However, a year ago, something changed. My weeping was different. I was going through a difficult time in my life as we all sometimes do. I realized then that my weeping was no longer of joy, but of pain and bitterness like Hannah, who wept because she was childless (1 Sam. 1:8). I see now that there is a danger in going through difficult times. They can affect us without us realizing our hearts are changed - my heart hardened and my tears of joy turned to tears of bitterness. I started to become affected when people made fun of me because of my weeping. Though they did not understand why I was crying and dancing for my Lord, I was hurt by their criticism and wept out of pain.

When my heavenly Father brought me miraculously to the BCW, I did not understand the purpose. I just knew that when I stepped into the grounds of the college, I started weeping and

could not stop. I had a vision of the beauty of Jesus. I then asked the Lord, "Why do I weep so much?" And He answered, telling me that I was in danger of dryness. I did not understand His message because my life is Christ and He is my delight. Then He further revealed to me what He meant during one of our morning chapel sessions - I saw a clear vision of Mary of Bethany breaking the bottle of perfume and washing Jesus' feet (Luke 7:38). Then God spoke to me,

**"My daughter, you are the bottle and your tears are the perfume. I need you to be broken in My presence just like that alabaster jar with your tears poured out on Me."**

Most of My sons and daughters have forgotten to cry in My presence because their ears are blocked and their hearts are like stones due to the difficulties that they have been through. Many cry, but this is only because of their pain, anger and bitterness. Those tears are sour to me. But when they break themselves onto me, their crying changes. Their tears take on the sweet aroma of perfume. They become

humble, and only a humble heart can experience true weeping. That is why, my daughter, I brought you to the BCW, to be broken in My presence and become the perfume that I desire, perfume that I was missing from you."

God told me to testify about this because the time is short and many need to come back to Him. I cried so much and instantly began to meditate on these words. We need to be humble and recognize that only through Him, can we feel His presence and know more of Him. Our brokenness will allow us to surrender completely to Him. At the BCW, my tears of joy have returned and I hope they will never stop!

I look around the magnificent grounds and my heart is filled with gratitude to the intercessors of old, the co-workers here at the BCW and the leadership of Cornerstone Community Church, Singapore, for their obedience to God to restore this place to its former splendour and to make it a place of restoration for those who seek God.

I am a 68-year-old student at the BCW and am totally amazed at the privilege of being here. Never in my wildest imaginations did I think I would be here but our faithful heavenly Father has a good plan for us all. My husband and I have been serving in Cambodia since 2002 and we had the privilege of parenting twenty-six underprivileged children for eight years. Out of that group has come amazing young people who now help us look after two businesses that help fund the 'Open Arms', an organisation that trains underprivileged Cambodians with practical skills, and we know it is God's will that they will be the leaders of 'Open Arms' in the future.

As you can well imagine, all the years of parenting teenagers in a cross-cultural situation took its toll on us - body, soul and spirit. But just as we thought we might retire, God asked us to open up a safe house in the red light district where sex workers, who live on the streets, can come and rest, bathe, and be totally loved. God gave me a vision of a nightclub, called the Heart of Darkness, becoming the Heart of the Father, where not only the sex workers but the perpetrators would be saved and gloriously set free.



Needless to say, I was excited and set about to do what God asked me to do. I worked so hard that I forgot about God, that it was His work and His people. I got worn out seeing women in their distress as I dealt with baby buyers, drug addicts and desperate situations. I just wanted to fix it all for these women and could not seem to give their burdens to God. As much as I loved looking after the women, I became very discouraged and so depressed that my health suffered. I was troubled as to how I could keep going but I kept pushing myself, thinking that I could not walk away from these problems no matter how hard it got.

I realized in the last six months that I had to do something about this exhaustion, more so in my spirit than in the natural. I could not sit still with God for any length of time. I could not talk with Him or hear His voice. Oh, yes, I prayed, but it was on the run. One thing I could do was sing, so I sang day and night - I was desperate as I could not feel His love or His presence. In fact, for the last few years, I have been worshipping by faith. Yet I now know that the beautiful Holy Spirit was working to help me. Oh, His faithfulness is overwhelming! When the opportunity to come to the BCW opened up, I was so afraid to leave, because I

thought that once I left Cambodia, I would not be able to return, and it saddened me as my heart is really for them. In my application I mentioned that I could not read or walk far, and I seriously wondered how I could possibly study, having not sat behind a desk since I was twelve. Though I was full of fear, I learnt a long time ago to just do it. So I came.

I did not realize how bad my spiritual state was until one of the students at the BCW shared about the blocked wells of our hearts. That day, my husband and I went and sat beside the well that had been recently discovered in the grounds and God spoke to me about this. "Just as I have restored this place to its former beauty, so too will I restore you. You will leave this place full of Joy. You will have a new walk and a new authority in Me."

Each day at the BCW, through His spirit and His aggressive love that moves in the wonderful lecturers and other students, God is taking away the layers of despair, betrayal, and fear but mostly, of grief and loneliness for the lost relationship with my heavenly Father. In the sixth week of the course, I felt the presence of God for the first time

in many years. I received a fresh vision for the red light district in Phnom Penh. And as my heart is opening up again, I am very excited to hear His instructions, to go forth with new anticipation, and to see what this amazingly faithful God will open up anew for my life in serving Him. I am sure I will never let Him go again. I will never leave my first love. I am so very grateful for this time and I will never forget it. My life will never be the same again.

I surrender all**



My insecurities pushed me to the point of being extremely competitive - failure was not an option. As I started to get better musically, academically, and in the area of sports; I became swallowed up in pride and a pursuit for perfection. Because I longed so much for acceptance, I also tried hard to please people in many ways. For many years, I derived my identity from the

good things I did well, but deep inside, I became more wounded especially when I encountered rejection.

Though I accepted Christ at 8 years old, many things within required the intensive work of the Holy Spirit to deliver me from bondage and self-pity, and I never saw how all of this was just the enemy’s plan to entrap me. On the outside, I continued to minister to others on the mission field, but God wanted to minister to my heart in a way I never experienced before.

I did not come to the BCW on my own initiative, but Nidia, a good friend who serves with me in South America, invited me to join her here. 

# WALKING THE LAND

Located in the old village of Loughor, Pisgah Chapel lies at the heart of the 1904 Welsh Revival. It was where the prayers and intercession of the saints birthed forth and rose to the throne of grace above, making way for the Kingdom of God to sweep through Wales like wildfire. Our hearts are hopeful there will be another fresh outpouring from Heaven in greater measure; this hope is sure and certain.

Pisgah is a prayer altar unto the Lord: a place set aside for communion with God in worship and intercession, and the fire on this altar shall not go out. The Lord continues to raise His intercessors to hallow and bless His

name, and the call to labour in prayer is a labour of love.

It is from this place of prayer that we are empowered and emboldened to go forth, and a number of the BCW students joined the staff and other committed prayer partners in an outreach to this precious neighborhood of Loughor. We teamed up in twos and threes, and went from door to door, with evangelistic tracts and invitations to an Open Day at Pisgah Chapel. This took place over three weeks and we managed to strike up conversations with members of the community, inviting them to join us and showing them glimpses of the Father's love.

One of our lecturers, Marilyn Harry, said, "Prayer and Evangelism go hand in hand." It was out of prayer that a staff member at Pisgah Chapel received the vision of walking the land. And it was from sowing in prayer that we went out to sow seeds in hope of reaping a harvest. Abraham was told by God to enter and walk the land of Canaan which God promised to give him. Abraham, in obedience to God, built a prayer altar wherever he stopped (Gen. 13:17). When we walk and pray, we become prayer altars that draw the Lord's presence and open the windows of heavens.

The seeds of revival have been sown into the ground through those who have gone on before us. As we walk, the ground is being watered. Isaiah 61:1 says that the Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is on us because He has anointed us to proclaim the good news. The chapter ends with the glorious promise from God, "as the soil makes the sprout come up and a garden causes seeds to grow, so the sovereign Lord will make righteousness and praise spring up before all nations." This is the promise and inheritance for the people of Wales - the Father has not forgotten Wales! His eyes are on His precious children, looking into every home of Loughor - He will bring them back to Himself.

**Our encounter with Peter, one of the locals, drove this very message home - that God is moving and restoring hope into this land which was once touched by His great hand.**

He was one of the residents who responded to our invitation, and he expressed that the visit had triggered his desire to pray for Loughor and Wales again. It was such a pleasant surprise when we saw him attend the Wednesday night prayer meetings regularly after the Open Day! He shared on Isaiah 43:16-21 because he had witnessed churches closing

down through the years, but he remembers that God can yet make streams through the wastelands, and urged us to pray for the thousands in the nation who have turned away from God. Such a restorative picture illustrates that God has not forgotten and He is preparing His people for a new move of revival. We remain expectant in prayer and that all in Loughor will encounter Him once again.

# ARMY ARISING

Just before coming to the BCW, I went on a short-term mission trip to Cairo, Egypt. Being a nurse by profession, my interest was piqued when I heard about an international ministry that provides help to refugees. I also felt God's peace to go in spite of the turmoil happening in the Middle East, and had the opportunity of visiting Sudanese refugees in their homes. It broke my heart to see them living in abject poverty, hearing about their hardships and how their lives were in constant threat because of the civil war in Sudan. Though they are displaced and marginalised, I felt strongly the Father's love and burden for them.

In preparation for and during the trip, I consistently heard the Holy Spirit say, "You are a warrior". Each time, I would reply, "I don't feel like a warrior, Lord", for I, honestly, do not look like one nor do I dress like one - however a modern warrior may look like! I am not a preaching machine or a walking Bible encyclopedia. Neither do I operate in the Spirit in an outstanding way like some do - with constant words of knowledge, profound prophecies, astounding visions, revelations in dreams, or mighty signs and wonders. Yet throughout my time here at the BCW, the Lord has been opening my spiritual eyes to the reality of spiritual warfare everywhere we go - in every ministry or mission field. If we acknowledge the reality of warfare in the natural, what more in the spiritual?


At the beginning of the course, a classmate shared that someone in Singapore had a prophecy revealed by the Lord - that our class would be

the 'gathering of the generals'. It immediately reminded me of God calling me a 'warrior'. The theme of warfare had resurfaced. Though I initially did not feel qualified to be in the BCW because of my young age and lack of ministerial experience, I am also reminded that we do not qualify ourselves, for only He, who calls us, qualifies us.

Looking back, the Lord had miraculously parted the Red Sea for me so I could go to Cairo as well as to the BCW. My parents gave their consent, and my workplace in Singapore approved of my leave of absence. This has been a time of sharpening of my spiritual tools; a time of preparation before I march onwards. Through the testimonies of my fellow classmates, I caught glimpses of the burdens the Lord has placed upon their hearts and the calls He has released over their lives. I recognise each of them as a soldier, general, or warrior in the army of God, and this must be how God sees me. The realisation of this truth has progressively awakened my heart, soul, and spirit to the clarion call of spiritual warfare, which resonates with me deeper than ever before.

After graduation, it may be that some of us may not yet know how the Lord will fulfill the vision He has placed in our spirits. Many of our hearts and lives are, currently, like blank canvases on which the Master will write and paint. And this is, precisely, the posture of surrender we are to be in throughout our lives. I would like to share this contemplation written before my trip to Cairo and the BCW, and we will go because He has sent us.

**The heart of the Father does not change even though He is our Commander-in-Chief; He is not one or the other; He is our Heavenly Father and our Captain. We are His sons and daughters, As well as soldiers in His army. When He sends us out to battle, He does not send us out with distant engagement. He sends us out with a Father's heart, Loving us more than anyone ever can In times of hurt and despair, Disappointment and discouragement, Devastation and grief, Heartache and pain, Suffering and sorrow, His heart feels and understands every emotion in ways we cannot even begin to fathom. He bears every burden, infinitely more than we can ever comprehend or imagine. To be sent out by our Father, the Commander-in-Chief, Is the greatest privilege that Any child and soldier can have.**





## KAIROS CHOICES

Luke 10:38-42

“Now it came to pass, as they went, that He entered into a certain village: and a certain woman named Martha received Him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, who also sat at Jesus’ feet, and heard His word. But Martha was cumbered about much serving, and came to Him, and said, Lord, dost thou not care that my sister hath left me to serve alone? Bid her therefore that she help me. And Jesus answered and said unto her, Martha, Martha, thou art careful and troubled about many things: But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her.”

The two-syllable word replayed in my mind through class as the Holy Spirit repeated Jesus’ words to Martha in the oft-told story. I found myself thinking about a conversation I had with the Lord in August this year when I asked Him why He seemed to be leading me, through a sudden and unexpected turn of events, to enroll as a student at the BCW this Fall.

“Mary chose the better part. Come away with me,” was all He said. And so, come away I did in August as I transited out of a hectic work schedule, and re-learned how to sit at His feet. Still, I was not expecting Martha to be my continued object lesson halfway through school term. Had I not already learnt to be like Mary by coming halfway around the world to Swansea?

I had always thought of Martha as the frazzled workaholic whom Jesus sighed over and Mary as the role-model God-gazer with whom He was well-pleased. “Martha, bad; Mary, good; be like Mary” seemed to be the refrain of every teaching regarding these two sisters. As a professional holding a God-assigned, demanding 24/7 job, participating in church ministry, and engaging in the multifarious activities of life, I often tried to shake off the guilt that arose whenever I was reminded of Martha and Mary during sermons. Everyone who has tried to be excellent in their tasks in life will no doubt empathise with Martha. She was only trying to do what was practical and necessary so that others could enjoy Jesus. What was wrong with that?

I often thought that Martha was so task-oriented that she would always choose service over sitting at Jesus’ feet. But for the first time, I saw that this was not true. The Holy Spirit led me to the passage in Luke (KJV), which noted that “[Martha] had a sister called Mary, who also sat at Jesus’ feet, and heard His word.” If Mary also sat at Jesus’ feet, Martha must have had those moments too.

“Needful” emphasised the Holy Spirit, yet again. I studied the scripture reference, and was wowed by a key lesson about living in the Spirit, which I would like to share as we prepare to transit back to our lives after the BCW: Do the needful, not the necessary! Jesus told Martha that one thing was ‘needful’ at that moment, and Mary chose to do that. *Creia*, the Greek word, for “needful”, speaks of the first order of duty in business or employment. It dawned on me that Jesus had an agenda at Martha’s home that day. While Mary discerned Jesus’ priority – the needful – and chose that as her “assigned portion” for the day, Martha did what seemed necessary, and she totally missed His plan. Indeed, practical service might have been His idea of “needful” for Martha on another occasion.

There were many times during lessons when the class discerned God’s *Creia*, and broke out of the standard schedules and tasks to do the needful, so that He could do what He deemed necessary – be it setting people free, bringing healing, or revealing Himself in a greater measure. Doing the needful became a lifestyle for us, as we received His assigned portions for our lives on a daily basis and experienced one kairos moment after another. It was a glorious way of living that we can continue to walk in as we leave the BCW. My prayer is that, like Mary, each of us will continue choosing the needful over the necessary as we return to our countries and our callings – the part that is ours and will not be taken away from us.







# HIS WORD, OUR WEAPON

My journey to Wales began in February 2015 when I heard Pastor Yang recount the amazing heritage, purchase and refurbishing of the BCW, and its role as a well of intercession for the UK and regions beyond. My spirit was stirred for I desired to learn the art of intercession. Amazingly, my steps were directed specifically to the Autumn 2016 semester in the BCW, not the semesters before or after it. This was because it was the exact three months that a sibling could take over the care of my elderly mother. The Lord has, indeed, made straight my paths for I trust in Him and acknowledge Him in all my ways (Prov. 3:5-6).

Before I left for the BCW, I asked the Lord what I should keep in mind during my time there. The next morning, just at the point of waking up, I received these words from the hymn, 'When I Survey the Wondrous Cross,' in my spirit:

*"See from His head, His hands, His feet,  
sorrow and love flow mingled down!  
Did e'er such love and sorrow meet, or  
thorns compose so rich a crown?"*

*"Were the whole realm of nature mine,  
that were an offering far too small;  
Love so amazing, so divine, demands my soul,

I was reminded of how Jesus "humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death" (Phil. 2:8). God is not a God of half-measures. Jesus gave Himself completely for us. Therefore, we, His children, surrender ourselves totally to Him. This means realigning our hearts, rewiring our thought patterns, and reordering our lives. At the BCW, I guard my time with Abba Father that I may grow in intimacy with Him, and hear His voice daily. I "take every thought captive to obey Christ" (2 Cor. 10:5), even good thoughts, such as the day's activities, or preparing for class devotions. Good thoughts can be strongholds because they can block the excellent thoughts of God and revelations from reaching us. I learned to immediately switch my thoughts to Bible verses to stop the devil from controlling my mind.

In the list of spiritual armour in Ephesians 6, God's Word, which is living and active, is the only offensive weapon: "In all

circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one...and take the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication." Constant prayer is the main weapon of spiritual warfare; it is the Christian's most powerful resource. "All" is used four times to emphasise that prayer is to permeate our lives. We wield this sharp two-edged sword to bring down strongholds which are located in the mind to obliterate the devil from our individual, family and church life altogether!

I have also learned to be more vigilant in order to bring down strongholds. When we were two-thirds into our journey at the BCW, the Holy Spirit prompted the class to begin morning intercessions corporately at 7am. We obeyed and surrendered anew to Jesus. We prayed everywhere - in the Blue Room, the Chapel, classroom, dining hall, and in the grounds. We adopted different postures - we bowed, we knelt, or prostrated ourselves. We spoke in tongues, proclaimed the promises of God, and spoke forth visions from Him. We declared healing into bodies and into difficult situations. We were led to intercede for nations. We worshipped, exalted, praised God and gave thanks for His abundant mercies. We broke the spirit of comparison, insignificance, and offence. We proclaimed the spirit of unity, love, and freedom. Truly, God is faithful, for the joy of the Lord came upon all.

At the BCW, I have climbed to a higher plane. The Lord has revived my spirit, granted me fresh revelations, and equipped me for the next stage of my journey and life's work. In one sense, our individual journeys are different, but in another sense, all students are on the same pilgrimage to the celestial city that John Bunyan described in *"The Pilgrim's Progress"*. We stop at different points to rest, recover, quench our thirst at the well of living water. Once we have regained our strength, we resume our march. The clarion call has been sounded and we position ourselves to receive His commission for our various assignments.

# I HAVE A VOICE

*During my first week at the BCW, I heard the Lord say to me, “You have a voice. You have a voice!”*

Subsequently, in the midst of talking with a classmate on what I had lost, the words, “It’s mine and I want it back!” burst from my lips. The enemy had stolen my voice which is my inheritance. This was again confirmed through a message by Brother Lameck at Ebenezer Chapel when he said that the devil steals from us by taking our sound! I realized then that this was what being a slave was about. When we are enslaved, the enemy takes our name, our voices, our identities and our freedom. I had been a slave but Jesus came to set me free. I am so grateful for my release into freedom by Jesus.

The Lord also revealed that the enemy was targeting my children. My daughter, Abigail, has loved to sing since childhood. When I spoke up during my devotional sharing, I was putting my feet on the neck of my enemy as Joshua did in the book of Joshua 10:24-25.

“Joshua called for all the men of Israel and said to the captains of the men of war who went with him, “Come near, put your feet on the necks of these kings.” And they drew near and put their feet on their necks. Then Joshua


**Isaiah 49:2**  
**"He made me a polished arrow; in His quiver He hid me away."**


