





DIRECTORS' MESSAGE

We would like to first of all congratulate you Batch 10, School of Ministry, Spring Term 2020 on your commencement.

Despite the quarantine, we are certain that the past 3 months have had many defining moments for many of you and as you graduate, we want to encourage you to keep pressing upwards and onwards toward the goal of the high call of God in Christ Jesus.

This is probably the strangest graduation ceremony we have ever had in the history of the college. Not in our wildest imagination could we have envisioned that we would be graduating online. This Covid-19 lockdown upended all our schedules but we are so glad that the Holy Spirit cannot be quarantined. We would have never imagined that our classes would have to be done online but everything worked out amazingly. We have heard so many good reports of the TENACIOUS 10 and you students have done exceedingly well. Kudos to everyone, the students, the staff, and faculty. Despite the quarantine, we are certain that the past 3 months have had many defining moments for many of you and as you graduate, we want to encourage you to keep pressing upwards and onwards toward the goal of the high call of God in Christ Jesus.

The theme of your graduation is "Tenacious" and the word comes from the Latin word, "Tenere", which means to hold on. I keep getting a picture of a bulldog and he has his mouth biting into a bone and he is not going to let it go. When you call somebody a bulldog, you are describing someone who is tough and tenacious and gets things done, especially in the face of adversity. Think of Winston Churchill's leadership during WW II. The reason we need to be tenacious in this hour is 2-fold.

That's how you win a battle, by lasting 5 minutes longer than the enemy does.



Firstly, there are many promises that God has given to us and we must like a bulldog, hold on to them. Never let go and never give up. Napoleon, the great French General once said that it is the last 5 minutes of the battle that determines the outcome. That's how you win a battle, by lasting 5 minutes longer than the enemy does. But such tenacity cannot be produced in one day. You can't live carelessly all your life and then hope to be miraculously ready when He returns. You have to deal with issues right now. The preparation has to be deliberate and disciplined. Most of us just drift along hoping that everything will turn out all right; no, it doesn't happen that way! Tenacity comes only by careful preparation. What God is seeking to build in us right now is stamina; spiritual stamina. We are going to need it because endurance is the key.

Secondly, in Acts 14: 21-22, we read "And when they had preached the gospel to that city and made many disciples, they returned to Lystra, Iconium, and Antioch, strengthening the souls of the disciples, exhorting them to continue in the faith, and saving, "We must through many tribulations enter the kingdom of God." This is the apostle Paul and he was at Lystra, and he had just been stoned, we believe, to death. The disciples gathered around him and prayed over him and he came back to life. Then he and Barnabas continue their journey and what did they do when they went to each city? There are 3 things that we are told they did. 1) They strengthened the souls of the disciples. Strength is going to be vital for us, especially in the last days. 2) They exhorted them to continue in the faith. That word 'Exhort' is a military word, which means 'Courage for the battle'. 3) They were preparing them with a message.

What was the message? The message was, "Through many tribulations, we must enter the Kingdom of God". Now, we wouldn't be faithful pastors if we are not preparing you for what is coming. We believe it is important that we are taught what to expect because this is something we don't hear very much in churches today. We don't know why, but pastors seem to avoid this whole issue of tribulation. People often ask us as pastors, what is the one thing that influences the decisions we make concerning the church? We will tell you right now, it is our theology that determines our decisions, especially our theology of the last days. Because we know what's going to happen in the last days, it influences and has a bearing on every decision we make. We have to have a crystal clear vision of what the future is going to be.

faith. But tribulation is part and parcel of the gospel and any pastor who neglects to warn his flock is negligent and he is not preparing them for what's coming. The word "Tribulation" in Greek simply means "made narrow by pressure". That's how the word translates. It comes from the Latin word 'Tribulem' which was used in Jesus' day to describe a threshing sledge with spikes underneath which ran over the corn to separate the corn from the chaff. Tribulation is when you feel everything is going over you and ripping you to bits. Why am I saying this? Because we need to develop a tenacious attitude if we are going to come out victorious.

If you ever feel like giving up, just remember that the last thing to grow on a fruit tree is the fruit. The only way that the enemy can win is if we give up. If you will keep on fighting, you will eventually get the victory. Think about it: Every miracle in the Bible started as a problem.

Everything you have ever been through, sat through, cried throug prayed through, everything is a set up for your next best season. So don't let those dream snatchers get you down. They will try to rob you of the light and fire in your heart. But don't get mad at them. Because they can only love you to the capacity that they can love themselves. Pray for them.

You might have messed up your life pretty bad but listen, we know you can't unscramble eggs but you can make a pretty nice souffle out of it. Or you can't piece together glass that has been shattered, but you can make a mighty fine mosaic out of it. So don't give up. Stay strong. Stay tenacious. And finally, don't put a period when God puts a comma because the story ain't over yet.

Once again, our heartiest congratulations to the Tenacious 10. You guys are an awesome bunch and we are so proud of you.

Tenacity is a set kind of faith, unique, a fixed focus that does not waver. It exhibits and withholds the beauty of an undivided heart.






SURRENDER

When we were called to the BCW, we felt it was to be equipped for the future ministry that God had in stored for us. Little did we know that God's plan for us both individually and as a couple was greater than what we have imagined.

The world-wide pandemic transformed the look of the course and our lives. The assignment that was set before the Batch was to pray for the nation of Wales. As we were locked down into our households, God gave us a slightly different assignment; to intercede for the College and especially for our fellow students. 














It impacted me reading of Mr. Rees Howells' predicament over the decision to surrender his whole being to the Holy Ghost. The Holy Spirit was working in Mr. Rees Howells and showing the roots of his nature which was 'self' but saying how He 'would never take anything away until I gave my consent' [p43]. The Holy Spirit can convict and show us roots of things in our lives which we never knew about, and it is up to us whether we allow the Holy Spirit to work through us. The Holy Ghost wants to abide in me forever, but for that to happen, "ALL my flesh must go out" [p41]. Two persons with different wills can never live in the same body. The Holy Ghost does not want us to have a 'superficial surrender' [p43], and tells Mr. Rees Howells that 'the life I will live in you will be one hundred percent for others' [p45]. Mr. Rees Howells finally yielded to be filled with the Holy Spirit and the glory of God came down on him that night. After he yielded, God used him mightily, being guided, and living in the Spirit and not by the flesh. The Holy Spirit wants to take full possession of me, to live fully in the Spirit and allow God to work mightily through me. Reading this made me ask myself which areas of my life I had not fully yielded to the Spirit and to allow the Holy Ghost to uproot and remove these things in my life. To become like

The other part that impacted me was when Mr. and Mrs. Howells were sent to a mission station in Gazaland. Through their obedience, God had promised them 10,000 souls would be saved. Within six weeks revival had come. As they travelled from station to station, they saw mass amounts of people receiving the Lord. During their time they trusted in God's protection, especially when sickness hit. People turned away from witchdoctors and sought protection from God. This impacted me because of my work in Borneo. Living in Borneo, you face much sickness and diseases. It encouraged me how God had comforted Mr. Rees Howells saying they "are needed to look after these sick ones" [p203] so to believe He "can keep the germ from overcoming you?" [p203]. We are covered by the blood of Jesus. The Lord had indeed used them both mightily in the African revival. I know that God can do this through me in Indonesia for His glory. When faced with difficult situations and sicknesses, that I may stand firm in my faith, knowing who I am in Christ and stand against the attacks that come my way. That His name be glorified by the people of Indonesia whom desperately need Him.


The Holy Spirit spoke to Mr. Rees Howells and all the students at the bible college that "there is all the difference in the world between your surrendered life in My Hands, and I living My life in your body." Interestingly, these people had as far as they were aware walked in surrender, forsaking all and following Him, yet here was a higher call to go deeper with Him. Reading the scriptures afresh, as 'The acts of the Holy Ghost' is the clarion call to move from surrender to abandonment. And what strikes me now as it did back then, upon reading of this mighty working of the Spirit, is the fact that there is a work to be done in our time and generation that only He can do through us, and not ourselves, which requires the same commitment. This is a call that requires a response from me, one which highlights Romans 12:1-2 and also the calling of the cross spoken of by the Lord in Luke 9:24. Surrender and a call to wait on God, to daily set time to be still and know Him, is the challenge the Lord set me into over the past two years. Reducing monologue in prayer to an awareness of dialogue, the importance of listening, and desiring to know what He is saying.

The Lord reminded me that from eternity, then into Genesis to Revelation and beyond, He simply seeks relationship with us. Surrender, in my experience, seems to build open space for us to facilitate God speaking to us whereas the call to abandonment increases capacity for God to speak not only to us but through us, which is the higher call in any season. Mr. Rees Howells looked like a person who might have been gifted with deep faith, with continual abiding in Christ and be given naturally given into intercession. However, looking at his whole life, we find that he was ambitious to gain worldly rewards such as money in his early stage of life but had gradually been transformed into "a vessel" to carry out God's purpose in his later life—first growth in his faith began with the born-again experience which he had after hearing the testimony of Maurice Reuben in the Unites States. Upon his return to the United Kingdom, he gained great spiritual power when he attended the Llandrindod Wells convention in 1906. His growth in faith continued when he took the vow of a Nazarite. In each phase, he was met with many tests of obedience and ultimately God required him to empty himself of his own will so that the Holy Spirit can fully work in of him. We also see that the gradual growth was not only in his faith but also in his accomplishment for the mission fields. His mission started with small things which he found around him such as healing of his uncle, housing tramps in his house and gradually moved to larger missions such as saving Jewish refugee children and interceding for nations and seeking God's intervention in the war years. When I think of myself, I was depressed thinking that I have not grew enough for many years and repeat the same failures or comparing my growth in faith to other's. History also shows us that revival is born out of persecution, and so we should also be grateful for the sacrifices and hardships of the early evangelists and reformers, who paved the way for us despite intense opposition and persecution by the churches.


It also explains what a move of God is and the difference between a refreshing or renewal; a revival; an awakening and a reformation. [p.11] This was something new to me. The book also reminds us that it is important to prepare ourselves, by learning what God has done in the past and to understand what the common factors of previous revivals were, and to be aware of the conditions needed to bring about a new revival.


The author emphasises that the most obvious characteristic of revival was prayer, [of one or more people, praying to God to move] preceded by a spiritual hunger and a longing for God to come and have His way on earth. He also states that there can be no revival without repentance or reformation or unity. All the great revivalists, such as John Wesley and George Whitfield, spent much time in the presence of God in prayer. During the Welsh Revival, Evan Roberts, had an intense prayer life, and his meetings had a strict format of confession, prayer and testimony. He would only do what the Holy Spirit was bidding.

In the Hebrides, where there were multiple revivals, the community was centred around the Church, and was soaked in prayer and an awareness of the presence of God. They had learnt how to "travail in prayer and pull heaven down to earth." [p.64]. God seemed to love this community of believers, as He showed by His many return visits. The message for us today is to learn from the past revivals and pray for God to bring revival, working through His prophets and intercessors, who can then begin to declare and pray it in. We need to pray and repent for our nation, like Daniel and to say no to compromise. We need to have clean hands and a pure heart before God and believe in the power of testimony. We need to keep our ears open and follow the leadings of the Holy Spirit and "hear a voice behind us, saying, 'This is the way, walk in it." [Isaiah 30:21]. We need to heed the instruction of John Wesley and evangelise our communities and "save as many souls as we can." [p.117] Reading the testimonies of Revival, which are a record of the power and glory of God, is like prophesying that it is going to happen again. [p.154] "The testimony of Jesus is the Spirit of prophesy." [Rev 19:10] The author makes it clear that revival seems to happen outside the Church, this the "new thing" that God wants us to do i.e. To get out into our communities, shine the light, light the fires and love people into the Church. To be fishers of men casting our nets on the other side of the boat, using the internet as a tool to reach the unreachable, and gather in the harvest of souls. Amen.
